(Number your answers, but you don't need to copy the questions. When complete, submit this file to the Georgia View "Site Structure" drop box.)

- 1. What is this interior page's URL? (Copy and paste a working link to the page.)
- 2. Does the site follow the *Web Style Guide*'s recommendations for folder and file names? (This should be obvious from the page's URL.)
- 3. Is the page's title descriptive and precise? Is it unique, or could the title be used on a number of other pages?

Examine the page's HTML code to answer the following questions. In Google Chrome, use "View > Developer > View Source" to reveal the page's code.

- 4. How many style sheets does the page use?
 (Use "Edit > Find" to search the page for the keyword stylesheet.
 Don't include the period.)
- 5. Does it use javascript?(Use "Edit > Find" to search the page for the keyword <script.Include the open bracket < but not the period.)
- 6. If it uses javascript, how many scripts are included in the HTML document? (Use "Edit > Find" to search the page for the keyword <script>. Include the open and close brackets <>, but not the period.)
- 7. How many div tags are included in this page? (Use "Edit > Find" to search the page for the keyword <div. Include the open bracket < but not the period.)
- 8. If the page uses div tags, does it use semantic names for the id's and/or classes included inside each div tag? Give examples of the names used.
